**Crossrail – Noisy work on the railway between Thorney Lane, Iver and Market Lane, Langley**

We have been installing piles to provide foundations for overhead line structures between West Drayton and Maidenhead and will continue electrification work until August 2016. Electrifying the route will enable faster, greener, quieter and more reliable journeys from 2019.

We always try our best to install the foundations using a vibration method. However, where the ground conditions are tougher, the vibration method isn't strong enough and we have to use a stronger but noisier technique which involves the foundations being hammered into the ground to complete the essential work.

This work mostly needs to be done during the nights on weekdays while the trains aren't running on the adjacent tracks, which is essential to provide a safe working area for our engineers. We will be working overnight in your area between:

- **21:00 Monday 09 May and 05:00 Tuesday 10 May**
- **21:00 Tuesday 10 May and 05:00 Wednesday 11 May**

Thank you for your on-going patience while we install the foundations for the electrification of the Great Western route. Managing the disruption to our neighbours is really important to us while we undertake this essential work. You will notice us continuing with other, less noisy piling methods and work associated with the electrification in your area at times within the working times below;

- **Until 31 August 2016: Most nights from 22:15 – 05:15 with work continuing on Sundays through the day until 18:00: Installation of piled foundations and other electrification work.**
